

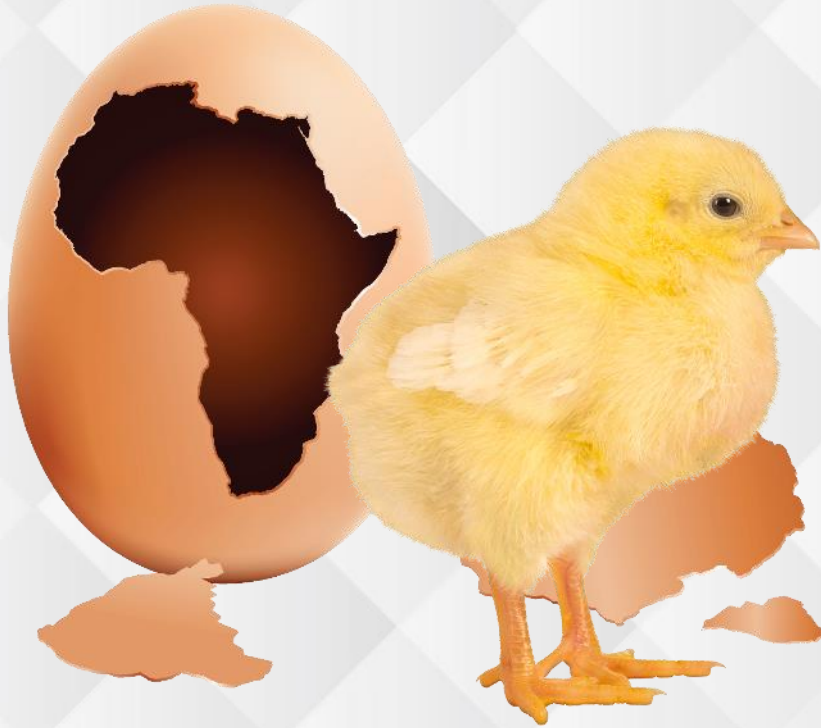

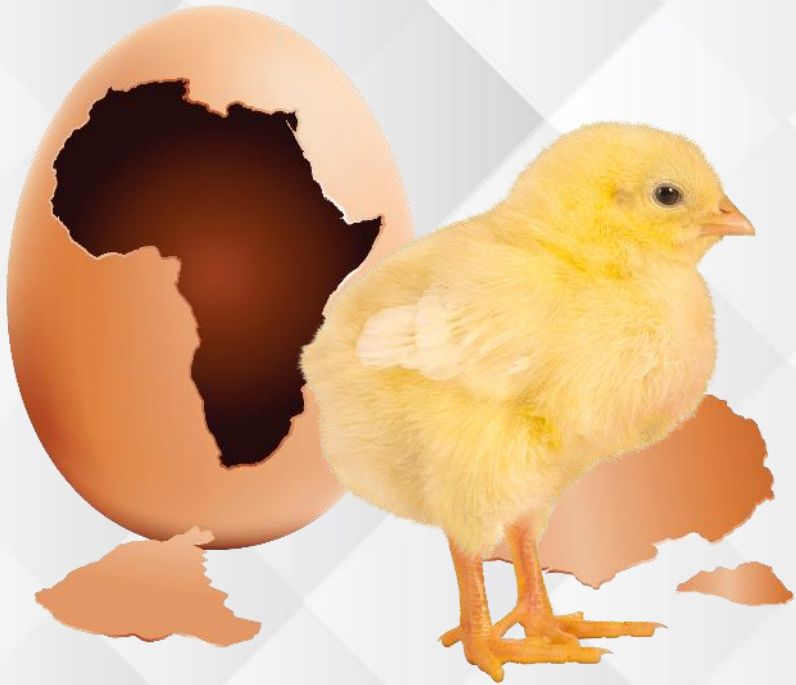


Disparity of Per Capita Egg Consumption around the World

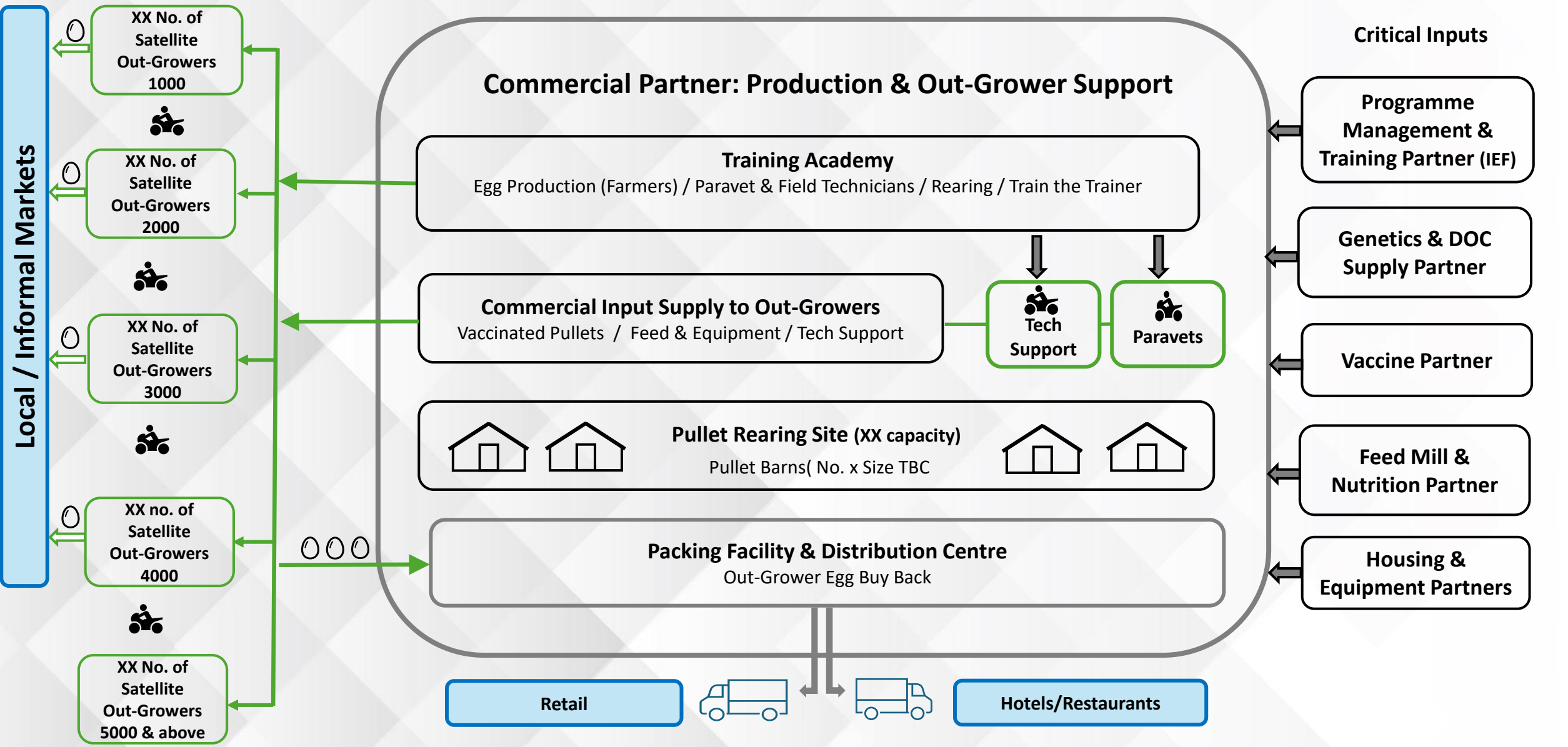
Challenges to Successful Egg Production in Sub-Saharan Africa

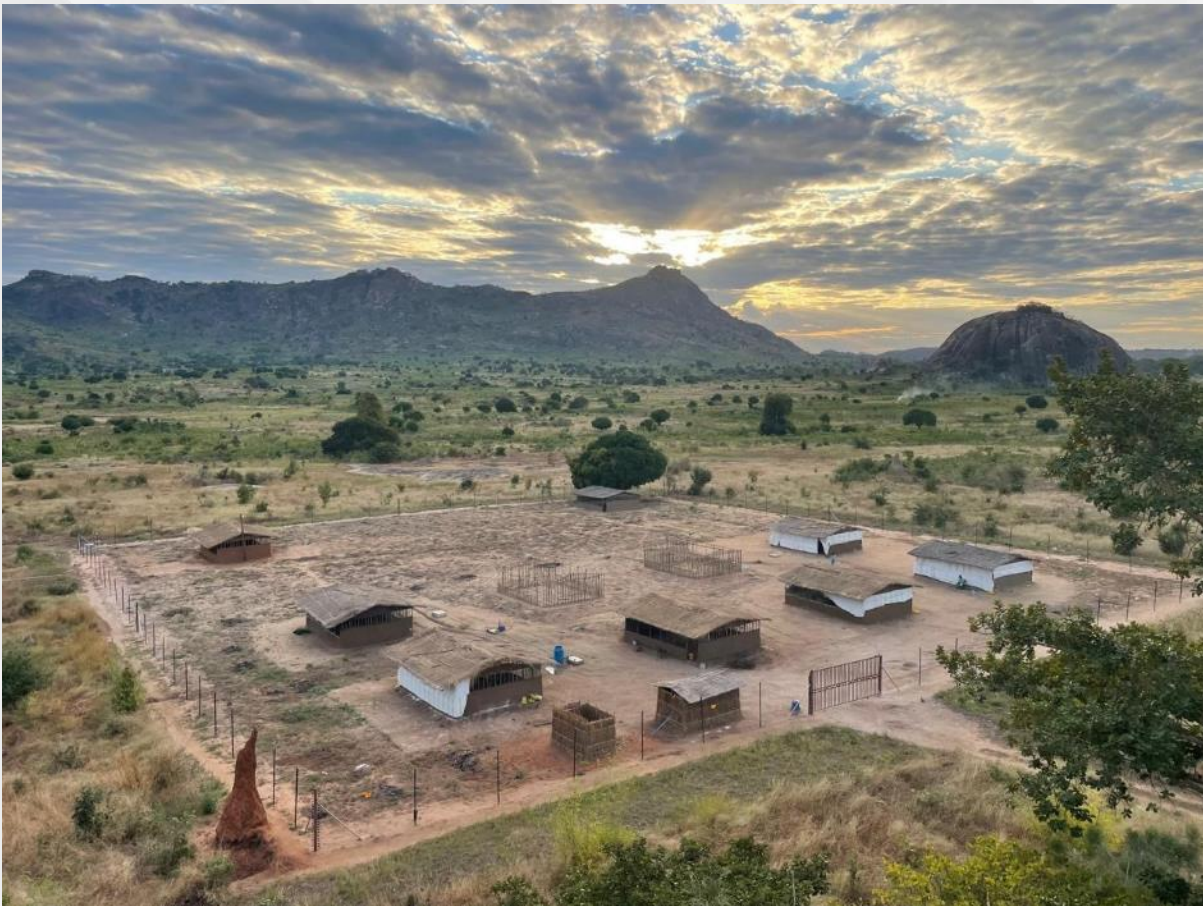


- Lack of Hatcheries

- Suitable Genetics



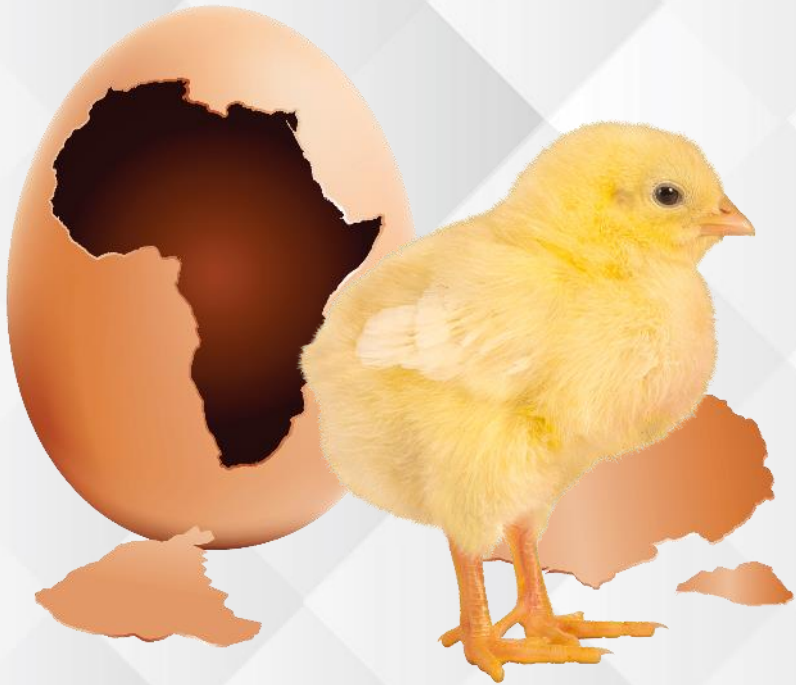


Conclusion: Successful Egg Production in Sub-Saharan Africa - The Impact
