What Gaps:

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Many vets are familiar with treating more exotic species, like large and small animals. But many vet practices are not familiar with poultry health and welfare.

What Gaps:

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- Ethiopia was considered as cattle producing country with little emphasis on Poultry sector
- Poultry production is one of the growing businesses in Ethiopia
- Large number of universities(with UG and PG) programs has limitation of course contact hours for the poultry production and health are very low and none of them are specializing in Poultry medicine
- To this effect the knowledge and skill of graduates does not satisfy the needs and requirements of the challenge in practice.



(Curriculum CONSIDER Professors to poultry house workers – what are the MUST TO KNOW

- 2. To include the appropriate trainees with effective impact(Private/public, field to leaders, big to small holder)
- 3. To train trainers (to identify leaders) and cascade down with practical and understandable messages ... sustainability



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Outputs

Post graduate poultry Medicine training course

- 90 Vets and Animal professionals in 3 sessions are trained
- 6 Mentees trained to perform next training ... For consistence



Master Program of PHM was developed and launched on 2022

• Second Batch is on attending the courses

Extension to other Ethiopian veterinary colleges found in various region of the country.

Almost more than 10 Veterinary colleges are benefited from this and now trying to have one specialized poultry Medicine training center at Bishoftu

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Outputs (in collaboration with all other stakeholders)

- CVMA became poultry Health specialized institution
- In and around Bishoftu designated as poultry and or livestock hub
- Ethiopia poultry population and production is significantly increased from around 50m to about 100m
- Additional Projects has been continuing like;
 - Prevent Field technician training,
 - Chicken health with Vet Agrosup of France and
 - Biosecurity training with MoA,
 - Other projects with Ghent University Poultry Health Science Chair(Belgium) and
 - Padova University of Italy and others)



Above all, recently the Ethiopian Government also launched 'Bounty of Basket' initiatives in which chicken is the first priority commodity



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
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Conclusion

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
Strengthen the integration of poultry courses in various Agricultural programs
